




## Meeting Minutes: December 6th, 2019

Their gifts are helping us provide care and comfort for the newborns recovering from prenatal drug exposures this holiday season.

Every baby comes to PICC's Newborn Nursery with a story, and lately those stories have been especially troubling. We've been seeing the effects of the opioid crisis on the babies for a number of years, but now we're seeing a resurgence of methamphetamine, as well. Many of the babies have been prenatally exposed to both heroin and methamphetamine, sometimes in combination with other drugs. I can tell you, though, that these little ones are amazingly resilient. Because of you, a new story of safety and healing can begin for each one of them.

## PCMC Christmas Party & Charity Auction a BIG Success!

The Annual PCMC Christmas Dinner and Charity Auction was a great success! Pasta, salad, pizza and desserts were provided by the club. There were 58 members signed in, and 4 guests. Even with 10+ tables set up we ended up with standing room only. Thank you to all who brought tables for the event.

There were more than 50 packages wrapped and donated for the auction. Ken Martin was our auctioneer, and Lisa Carlson was our very own Vanna White, holding the packages high as the bids kept coming.

All the proceeds of the auction were designated to two local charities, Pediatric Interim Care Center and the Toys for Joy program coordinated by the Kent Firefighters. Members who won the bid on a package were able to choose how to distribute their auction donation. The total auction proceeds were \$3,290. PICC received \$2,000 of the auction proceeds and Toys for Joy received \$1,290.

Ken Martin delivered the auction proceeds to the charities. The staff at PICC were again very grateful for the support of PCMC and asked Ken to pass along their thanks.

Ken met with Gordy Plett and Martin Oliver from the Kent Fire Department representing Toys for Joy to pass on the donations from the club. They said the Fire Department feels like they are only a coordinator for this program, and that the real sponsor of the program is the community itself. Our monetary donations will be used to purchase gifts for those age groups for which there were not enough donated toys. Ken says that being able to pass on the support of PCMC to these worthy causes is one of the best parts of being a member of PCMC.



## A wrap: Toys for Joy program collects more than 5,000 gifts for local children

The Kent firefighters' annual Toys for Joy program collected more than 5,000 toys for local children this holiday season.

Puget Sound Regional Fire Authority, Kent Firefighters Local 1747 and the Kent Firefighters Foundation collected, sorted, wrapped and delivered – on Friday morning – the new toys to needy families in the community, including at the Kent Food Bank, Maple Valley Food Bank and the SeaTac Holiday of Hope program.

In addition to toys, nonperishable food and monetary donations were accepted.

Toys were shipped to Kent Lutheran Church for distribution early Friday.

Puget Sound Fire also supported the Jerry Woods Holiday Engine – a longtime Maple Valley tradition. The Holiday Engine visited neighborhoods in Maple Valley and Covington, beginning the first weekend in December, to collect food and gifts that went to the Maple Valley Food Bank for distribution. To date, the Holiday Engine program has collected more than \$15,400 and over 24,000 pounds of food for Maple Valley and Covington area families.

The Kent Firefighters Foundation will be distributing approximately 40 food baskets to pre-identified families on Sunday.

Firefighters wish to thank the community for its support, with special appreciation to corporate donors: PODS; Reddaway Trucking; Bowen Scarf Ford; Hermanson; Target; and the Renton Mustang Club.

Eighteen club members gathered at Dick & Karen Knight's garage on Saturday, December 21st for an action-packed tech session on maintenance and troubleshooting on Valerie and Philip Maher's 1966 Coupe. After the customary donuts and coffee were consumed, we got down to business going over the car and inspecting what needed to be replaced or fixed. Here are just a few of the things that were done and identified for extra attention afterwards:

- Checked and adjusted all four brakes
- Repacked front wheel bearings
- Inspected front suspension, identified items that need future attention
- Checked and replaced the radiator cap that was not holding pressure
- Removed drive line to check U-joints
- Checked differential for looseness - needs attention
- Removed non-functional horns that had been installed in the engine compartment

Valerie and Philip dutifully followed our tech advisors Dick Knight and Chris Johnson around the car, listening to their advice and instructions. By the time it was over, Philip had a long to do list to follow up on. Both Valerie and Philip were grateful for all the help and info they received. Fellow member Craig Johnson has also offered to help them going forward as well.

Thank you to Dick and Karen Knight for offering up their garage and lift, and to Dick and Chris Johnson for putting together the tech session and lending their help and expertise to fellow club members.

PCMC exists in part to help our members learn about and work on their Mustangs. This is just one of the great things about being a PCMC member!
